TOUCHING UP METAL FINISH

The following are general guidelines for the application of touch up paint.

For the more severe chips and scratches that have gone through the primer/are down to bare metal, the following would apply:

- 1. Protect the surrounding area from any overspray.
- 2. Remove all rust if present.

It is essential that all rust is removed to bare metal before painting. Utilize abrasive tools like fine-grain sandpaper or wire brushes to remove all rust. On parts that cannot be reached by sanding or wire brushing, it is recommended that a rust converter be applied to the rust prior to painting. Note, rust converters don't remove rust and will leave a textured appearance after the item is painted.

- 3. Lightly sand the area and "feather" the edges between the bare metal and powdercoat finish. Remove any loose finish materials.
- 4. Clean the area with a solvent such as paint thinner.
- 5. Allow it to dry.
- 6. Apply a zinc primer.
- 7. Allow it to dry completely.
- 8. Apply the matching DuMor touch up paint.
- 9. Allow it to dry completely.
- 10. Add a second coat (if necessary).

For the more superficial scratches, the following would apply:

- 1. Protect the surrounding area from any overspray.
- Buff the area with a Scotch-Brite[™] pad.
- 3. Wipe the area clean with a solvent such as paint thinner.
- 4. Allow it to dry.
- 5. Apply the matching DuMor touch up paint.
- 6. Allow it to dry completely.
